Application Tips:

- If you are a veteran, be sure to upload your DD-214 form along with your application materials.
- Read and answer the Supplemental Questions completely. Your answers are an important part of your application and may determine whether or not you are invited to interview for a position.
- Read the position announcement carefully before you begin your application to make sure you understand the requirements of the position.
- If a resume and cover letter are required, consider tailoring them to the requirements of the position for which you are applying.
- Be sure to include all of the required application materials (e.g. resume, cover letter, etc.) Your application may not be considered if it is incomplete.
- Before submitting your application, carefully review your resume and cover letter (if required) as well as your answers to Supplemental Questions.
- You will be notified by email of the status of your application. The hiring process takes several weeks, so you may not be contacted right away.

Select the job categories that interest you and for the next 12 months you will be notified by email whenever a position opens at the college that matches one or more of the categories you've chosen.
