

Message from the Executive Director

Community Neighbors,

In April of 2023 we received an enrollment letter from the Office of Head Start. The letter states that we have to be at 95% of full enrollment by April 2024. At the end of the 2022/2023 school year we lost three Head Start classrooms in Edmonds School District. Therefore, for the 2024/2025 school year we opened a new site in Lynnwood.

The program has also had some difficulty in hiring Early Head Start Home Base staff. We have not been able to fill five positions, further adding to the low enrollment issues. As a result, the program developed some aggressive plans to make changes to programming to meet the enrollment requirements.

These changes are very exciting and will better meet the needs of families and the community. For the 2024/2025 school year we will offer more school day programming, doubling the number of this model of classes for children 3-5 yr. olds. We will also be opening Early Head Start center base classrooms, for toddlers and infants.

Head Start & Early Head Start Classrooms

Child development and family support services available for children ages 3 to 5 who are low-income and in Snohomish reside County. Services include comprehensive preschool, home child visits, parent and activities. health screenings, meals, opportunities to volunteer, and parent involvement activities. Part day and school day preschool classes, 4 days a week.

Early Head Start Classrooms

Child development and family support services for children 0-3 yrs. Services include comprehensive preschool, home visits, parent and child activities, health screenings, meals, opportunities to volunteer, and parent involvement activities.

Early Head Start—Home Base

Our Early Head Start program serves families with children birth to three years in a Home Base model. Home Base involves weekly home visits that offer child development activities to help enhance school readiness goals at an early age.

Enrollment

Since the pandemic began in 2020, our program has struggled keeping full enrollment. Facing continuous staffing shortages and losing classroom space has contributed to this challenge. Enrollment has been a large focus for the program.


Average Monthly Enrollment


Enrollment by Eligibility










Child Outcomes

Health

Edmonds College Head Start & Early Head Start knows that healthy children are happy, learning children. Some requirements of our program are to complete developmental assessments, track well-child exams and health screens for every child. These assessments have helped many children receive much needed services and resources that might have otherwise gone unnoticed. We know that the earlier a child receives services, the more successful they will be in school.



During our health screens we found:

7 children had hearing problems

11 children had vision problems.

Prenatal Services

Our Early Head Start Prenatal service includes:

- Safe sleep for infants
- Connection to community resources
- Preparing for baby's arrival
- Parenting concepts
- Healthy practices

Mental Health & Disabilities

Our Disabilities and Mental Health Consultant works as a team to support teachers in identifying the physical and social emotional needs of children. Our team also offers ongoing technical assistance and coaching for parents around referrals and ongoing work with the school district for children with IEP's or IFSP's.

Ages & Stages Questionnaire provided reliable, accurate developmental and social-emotional screening for children between birth and age 6.

- Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) is completed on each child within 45 days of enrollment
- Ongoing assessments are completed year round with Teaching Strategies
