Steve has some advice for students who are transferring to UW and to any other large university, he says:" try to get involved in school life, when you go from a small and friendly campus like Edmonds CC to a huge campus like UW, you tend to be shy. You can't be shy, your attitude needs to change and you need to open your mind and your heart to people". He finalized his interview by saying:"I miss
