	What is ACCE and accreditation? The American Council for Construction Education (ACCE) is a non-profit org that accredits construction education programs at colleges and universities. The mission is to promote and support high-quality construction ed programs and help students identify institutions that offer such.	
	<ul> <li>There are multiple parts to accreditation. Some of them are:</li> <li>A detailed review process called a self study (we pull together documents and data around 9 programs areas evaluated)</li> <li>A site visit by the visiting ACCE team</li> </ul>	

- Reports are generated (preliminary "pre-report", initial post review	
feedback/notes, formal report	
- The formal report (Feb 2025) leads to action taken for program improvement	
Preliminary Results/Next Steps:	
We passed. Awesome! For now, we are working off of initial feedback/notes.	
Formal report and detailed spreadsheet to be issued in Feb 2025	
We know that we had challenges with section 9 of review; we may be required to	
provide an update in 6 mosOR- it might be a 3-year check in)	
Moni attend Feb Conference TX – onboarded

Again Section 9 Academic Quality Planning Process and Outcome Assessment, may

-CMSA mentioned for peer mentoring, industry connection, interaction w/ admin,	
building comradery, fundraising, etc.	
2-Deficiencies:	
-Section 9 on ACCE, specifically closing loop on quality improvement plan items and	
need for rubrics and rubric goals. We also need to take a look at what kinds of data	
we're collecting for students and get on the right track.	
3-Opportunities/Potentials	
-Certificate programs or CEUs that could bring alums back and generate revenue	
-Utilizing library better – Many resources not used around marketing, scholarships	
-Alignment with Career Action Center for jobs, branding, promotion	
-CM Plans Reading Rooms/Simulation trailer	
-IAB underdeveloped—needs structure (bylaws, membership structure, sched, etc.)

Civil Courses	<ul> <li>-Faculty workload</li> <li>-Enough admin support (current admin supports 14 depts)</li> <li>-Succession planning (retirements)</li> <li>-Enrollment goals may not be properly funded by college—capacity issue</li> <li>-Software/HW – Computer labs not up to par. 2-D and 3-D models and it's slow.</li> <li>Students and faculty experience issues.</li> <li>Dave J. is retired. Before he left, he was instrumental in helping us get set up for</li> </ul>	
	accreditation. He was like our living memory. We're grateful. His Civil courses distributed amongst faculty Structural Design - Myself Concrete Class - Chris Surveying - Chris and Myself Civil Construction (Patrick will speak to these needs and candidate interviewed)	
Building Codes Courses	Rob Kilmer put out a call amongst colleagues to find an instructor. Dave Swayse ('new' Dave). Doing a great job. Passionate about his teaching. Building off Jeannie's courses.
